- 3. Exhibits to be at the show between 7:00am and 8:15am, show day and from 7:00pm and 8:00pm on Friday night.
- 4. Exhibits to be removed between 4:00pm and 4:30pm, otherwise at the discretion of the steward.
- 5. Exhibitors in the Cut Flower section to supply own containers.
- 6. Any handwork or photography must be done by exhibitor.
- 7. All exhibits must be grown by exhibitor.
- 8. All persons, except the stewards and judges, must leave the judging areas before judging commences at 8:15am.

#### SULTANA CAKE RECIPE for Classes 215 & 244

#### SULTANA CAKE

400-500 gm Sultanas
Water to cover
200 gm butter
½ tsp vanilla essence
½ tsp almond essence
½ cups sugar
3 eggs
1 cup Self Raising Flour
½ cups Flour

#### METHOD:

Wash fruit and place in large saucepan. Cover with water and bring to boil, then simmer for 10 minutes. Drain fruit thoroughly, add cubed butter, essences and sugar. Stir until butter melted then stand to cool. While mixture is cooling, beat the eggs. Only when mixture is cool enough add the beaten eggs (if too warm they will scramble). Add the two flours. Stir until well mixed but do not over mix. Line your 20 cm tin or 23 cm round tin with baking paper. Pour into cake tin and bake @ 175 degrees for 1½ hours or until skew comes out clean.
